
Lego therapy is a play based piece of intervention which focuses on developing collaborative play skills. It was introduced by Dr Daniel LeGoff in 2004.

This social skills intervention considers why and how Lego Therapy can be effective in supporting Children and Young People with ASC to improve social communicative competence and social inclusion

This course will provide an overview of how to set up and deliver this evidencebased intervention.
